FROM THE RECTOR

"Courage is resistance to fear, mastery of fear—not absence of fear." (Mark Twain)

I've been thinking about courage recently – not least as we move towards Remembrance Sunday again. Every year, I guess we are all humbled and grateful to think of every man and woman who resisted fear, even paralysing fear to fight, suffer and die for the freedom we enjoy.



And it continues. Every look at the news reminds us of the extraordinary courage being shown by people in Ukraine – and Iran, and...

And it makes me wonder how we, as a generation, would cope, if called to extraordinary courage (perhaps our uncertain world makes it less unlikely than it did) - or how I cope when called to the common courage of life.

Partly, as well, I wonder how much we value courage nowadays. The list of "top virtues" seems to have changed quite a lot since WWII. Kindness, compassion, sensitivity, and inclusiveness are very high up the list — arguably higher than the "grit" of the "keep calm and carry on" generation. And much of that is very good. Having long experienced the 1970s blind-eye-to-bullying, I rejoice in a much kinder society! But, we so easily swing from one end of the pendulum to the other, don't we? Why swing between kindness and courage? Both are needed.

The Christian conviction, of course, is that we see both perfected in Jesus. In the Garden of Gethsemane were told that he sweated blood. *Hematidrosis* is a known condition – severe mental anxiety, acute fear or extreme stress can make you sweat blood – and apparently that happened with Jesus. No surprise. Not only was he about to die the death that gave us the word *excruciating* but to do it under the horrors of the just punishment of God on sinners (as our substitute, so we need not). And yet he overcame that overwhelming fear and went ahead to do it for us. The supreme act of kindness – and the supreme act of courage.

Remembrance – once again, a time to give thanks for the courage (and kindness) of those who overcame fear to die for our freedom, to give thanks for the One who did that supremely, and to pray that we may know how to be courageous, not only for ourselves, but for others, if and when that is the call to us.



THE BISHOP'S LETTER







Called to walk the way of the cross

As I prepare to be installed as the 80th Bishop of Bath and Wells on the 12 November, I have been reading and re-rereading the charge given to me by the Archbishop of Canterbury when I was legally confirmed as bishop back in June. The charge can found be on the diocesan website. Please do take a look at what it says.

The charge is terrifying. It calls me to walk the way of the cross. It urges me to rely not on my own strength, but on that provided by the Lord. The charge asks me to 'speak out on behalf of the voiceless, and for the rights of all who are vulnerable' (Proverbs 3:18). It reminds me that I am to be the shepherd of the flock entrusted to me. It also includes calls to be committed to the highest standards of safeguarding and care of the environment.

Reading my charge makes me wonder whether I have been invited to impersonate the Archangel Gabriel! Thankfully it also includes words which act to make the whole thing possible. Chief among these is this phrase: I am called to 'build a church where each stone is valued'. Drawing on the writings of the First Letter of Peter (see Chapter 2), the charge calls me to remember that I'm not doing this all alone. We are doing it all together.

I've already been discovering this as I've travelled around Somerset attending worship in different churches and meeting new clergy colleagues. The installation will see people gather from across the county, committing together to our vision of 'Living and Telling the Story of Jesus'. Undertaking that task with authenticity and integrity is the greatest charge of all. It's one that I'm looking forward to sharing with you.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

'For he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things' Psalm 107:9



BAKED MACARONI - MALTESE STYLE

Ingredients:

- 500g Rigatoni Pasta (or Penne Pasta)
- 700ml Tomato Paste
- 500g Lean Minced Beef (or half beef and half pork)
- 3 eggs
- 1 onion, chopped
- 100g Edam or Cheddar cheese, grated
- Vegetable Oil
- 1 level tsp mixed herbs [optional]
- Salt & Pepper to taste

Heat the oil and fry the onion until soft and transparent.

Add the minced meat and cook until brown. Remove any excess fat from the pan. Add the tomato paste (and herbs, if used). Simmer for about an hour on medium heat, stirring the sauce occasionally. [If you are in a hurry cook for 30 minutes on high heat, but the slower the cooking the better the sauce]

In the meantime cook the pasta in boiling water. [Tip: if the pasta packet says 12 minutes, cook it for 10 minutes instead to avoid having a soggy pasta dish] Preheat the oven to Gas Mark 5 [200°C].

When pasta is done, drain the water and leave the pasta in the pan [make sure you use a big enough pan].

Add the sauce to the pasta and crack the 3 eggs in the pasta/sauce mixture. Mix in the eggs very gently to avoid damaged the pasta shapes.

Put in a baking dish about 30cm & 15cm and sprinkle the cheese on top.

Bake in the oven for about 30-45 minutes or until the cheese is melted, bubbly and golden.

When cooked, leave to set for about 10 minutes and then cut a nice piece and ENJOY!!!!!!


When opening the door he underwent an amazing transformation. His face was wreathed in smiles and he hugged his two small children and gave his wife a kiss.




