So writes Lee Strobel a legally trained journalist who set out to disprove the resurrection of Jesus. One of a fair number

who have taken that rather "dangerous" path – and found the tables turned on them by the evidence. The fact is that when we really look at the evidence for the physical resurrection of Jesus – it is pretty compelling.

And that matters – a lot. Some people think there's value in the Christian faith whether or not it is true. If it reassures people, brings a sense of peace – surely it is helpful. But surely not. Who wants *fantasy comfort* when we live in a real world – with real problems and real death?


But if – in fact – Jesus rose, things are very different. There is more challenge, but also real comfort:

- We need to take him very seriously. The Bible insists that His resurrection means that he is alive and that one day we will meet him and be accountable to him for every minute of our lives. That's very serious. Make no mistake for all of us our account with him is very heavily in the red.
- Yet we can trust in his forgiveness. If Jesus stayed dead, and his dust is still in Palestine there's no reason to think his death is different from any other. If he rose there is solid reason to believe the Bible claim that his death was different. He paid the debt for those who truly trust and follow him.
- And we have a hope as people who are going to die. That's 100% of us no exceptions and it is highly rational to fear it. People say that nobody knows what is beyond death but not so. If Jesus died and rose again, then he has been there and come back. Nobody better to help us through.

As I write, Easter is a few days away and it will still be Eastertide when you read this. The good news of Easter is *fact-based comfort* that lasts forever. I wonder whether you've looked at the evidence – and found the comfort (you might try the website above as a start – or come to church to ask your questions) With my prayers and very best wishes CJ



THE BISHOP'S LETTER



Life in abundance It all happened so quickly. I went to A&E with severe back-pain which affected my mobility. The NHS was outstanding. Within a dizzying few hours, I heard I would need an immediate MRI scan and possibly rods to support my spine. I dreaded the thought of going into the scanner, let alone the surgery. As I was being wheeled along the corridor, Lauren, my Godson's 10-year-old daughter, came into my mind.

Lauren is a talented girl passionate about football. Just over a year ago, it was discovered that she had a growth at the base of the spine which would need radical treatment to prevent spinal curvature. She would also require rods in her back which could be regularly extended by surgery as she grew into adulthood. In addition, this ten-year-old would be spending lonely hours in a soul-less scanner. Lauren is lovingly supported by her wonderful family and magnificently treated by NHS professionals, but while it can be shared, the load is ultimately hers to carry. Parents bear the agony of powerlessness. In the middle of this painful dilemma, young Lauren is instinctively grabbing the God-given gift of abundant life which is for all and which lies at the heart of the Gospel. As we get older, less passionate and more cynical we can lose faith in this gift.

As I was being taken to the radiology department, I realised that I was being strengthened and inspired by this young girl, six decades my junior, facing far greater challenges than me. My own fears were being transformed by Jesus Christ's gift of life mediated through Lauren's courage. Life may turn out differently from what we expect, but that does not restrict its abundance.

The young are an inspiration. It is the role of the older generation to ensure they can grow into the special people God has created them to be so that they can release the gifts they have for us all. Thanks, Lauren. Despite all she faces, Lauren continues to play football.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Genesis 1:11

PEACHES CARDINAL 5 cups of Water 300g Caster Sugar 6 large peaches peeled and halved 2 inch piece of Vanilla Pod or 1 teaspoon Vanilla Essence

> Sauce Cardinal 1 lb fresh or frozen Raspberries 100g sugar Juice of 1/2 a Lemon 1 tablespoon of Kirsch or Brandy

2pints of good Vanilla Ice Cream 2oz Blanched Almonds for garnish

Place water in a pan and heat to boiling point stirring in sugar until dissolved. Pour peaches and syrup into a bowl and cool in fridge.

<u>To make sauce</u>. Place raspberries in a heavy pan and heat gently until soft. Remove from heat and puree or press through a sieve. Add sugar and Kirsch, mix well and chill.

<u>To assemble</u>, Place a scoop of ice cream and one or two peach halves into 6 individual bowls. Pour over the raspberry sauce and sprinkle with almonds. Serve immediately.

THE ROAD TO EMMAUS TODAY Luke 24: 13-25



EL QUBEIBEH, West Bank – The biblical "road to Emmaus" is today a dirt path marked by the remnants of ancient Roman paving stones in this Palestinian village. El Qubeibeh, as Emmaus is today known, is nestled into a terraced West Bank hillside about eight miles northwest of the modern boundaries of Jerusalem.

Could the Roman paving stones, in this rather dark photo, be the stones that Jesus walked on when He appeared to two of His disciples on the road to Emmaus soon after He had risen?

A powerful tale, one filled with lessons about discernment, hope, and the truth of the Old Testament prophecies.

The archaeology is still going on.



feel if they were a refugee and what a warm welcome might look like, bringing the conflicts and crisis in Ukraine into focus.




