

FROM THE RECTOR

"What are you going to give up for Lent? I wonder if anybody has asked you that this year. Sometimes, of course, it's just seems a good opportunity to cut down on chocolate or wine or whatever. But we also know that it's somehow supposed to be to do with God — and presumably that means he wants us to "give things up".



The problem, though, is that lots of people assume that's what God is basically like. We easily think that what he really likes is to make us "give things up" – spoil our fun, stop us doing the things we really want to do and make us do rather boring things instead...

And that's a big problem – because it is *not* what the Bible says. Yes, the Christian faith does call us to give (some) things up – but *only* so our hands are empty and God can give us something better instead.

And God's gift is better – it's better than anything we can have in this world. We find that difficult to believe – but what God has on offer is free forgiveness, which gives us a free pass into infinite joy. That's heaven – the deepest joy, with no regrets, nothing to spoil it, never coming to an end. And Christians know that we begin to taste that even in the here and now. It is difficult to think of a better gift... The thing is, though, we can't receive all that if we are holding on to other things that we want more – whatever they are... And we easily do that. The Christian writer C.S. Lewis wrote:

"We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. We are far too easily pleased."

Which takes us back to Lent... Lent is really not about giving up chocolate — but giving up the "mud pies" — an annual reality check to make sure we have empty hands, ready to receive the precious gift of "infinite joy".

With warmest best wishes and prayers – for a Lent that leads you into joy.



THE BISHOP'S LETTER



The promise of new life

"Lord, when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you?"

For any would be follower of Jesus, the teaching in Matthew 25 is surely some of the most challenging in the whole of the New Testament. What sort of disciples are we called to be? Will the world recognise Christ in us both in our words and in our actions?

Faced with persecution, with the temptation to instant popularity and self-aggrandisement, Jesus remains true to himself and to his call to be a servant leader. This, he says, is what is required of anyone who would follow me: "to love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself".

While we may talk a great deal about being a welcoming Church, the reality is much harder to achieve. To welcome is not to want the stranger to become just like us. It's about valuing the gifts they bring and about being willing to be changed ourselves by the new life coming among us. It begins, as Jesus began, by seeking to serve the stranger's needs and, to do that, we first have to listen.

Some of the harshest of Jesus' words were directed to the religious people of his day, too occupied with their own agendas, their own self-righteousness, to notice the stranger in their midst. It is only when we are prepared to leave the security of our own home, "launching out into the deep", going onto the other's territory, can we begin to feel just how strange and at times threatening the community of faith can be to the outsider.

Lent, with its invitation to de-clutter our busy lives, brings also the promise of new life. Let's use this God-given time to pray that our hearts and the life of our communities may be opened such that we can truly welcome the stranger as a sister or brother in Christ.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

POTATO LATKES

Ingredients

2 Large Maris Piper potatoes (600g t0tql)

1 Onion

4 Tablespoons Plain Flour

2 Large free range eggs

Vegetable oil, for frying

1/2 a bunch of fresh herbs , such as sage, rosemary thyme (15g)

Scrub the potatoes, then coarsely grate (skin and all)

Peel and finely slice the onion

Place in the middle of a clean tea towel and wring out the liquid, transfer to a large bowl. Add he flour and crack in the eggs, season with sea salt and black pepper, mix well to combine.

Place a large frying pan on a medium heat with enough oil to cover the bottom of the pan.

Shape small handfuls of the potato mixture (roughly the size of golf balls) into latkes, flattening gently, then add carefully to the pan.—you may need to work in batches.

Fry for 1 to 2 minutes on each side, or until golden and crisp, drain on kitchen paper.

Scatter the herbs into the pan with the remaining oil. Fry for a few seconds until crisp, then remove to the kitchen paper before sprinkling over the hot latkes.

THE HISTORY OF MOTHERING SUNDAY A Mothers' Union Article



Back in the 16th century, on Mothering Sunday, people used to return to the church where they were baptised, or the local parish church. This was known as their 'mother church'. The essence of this practice was that people remained in touch with the community they had grown up in. The actual service took place on the fourth Sunday of Lent and symbolised the coming together of families.

As time moved on, the make-up of communities entered a stage of transition. Mothering Sunday was adapted to fit the evolving nature of local people and places. Many families became disbursed due to upheavals within society. Related to this, the practices associated with the day changed too.

As practices gradually changed, it became a day when servants of large households and country estates were allowed to return home to visit their families. The traditions associated with the day were changing too. The day itself became less focused on the religious roots and more about specific relations within families.

By the early 20th century the practice of returning to one's 'mother church' had become so neglected in the UK and Ireland that there were calls to revive it from social activists of the time. Consequently, decisions were made throughout the country to incorporate wider practices from across the Christian faiths and bring back a festival.

During the 1950's, figures in business spotted commercial opportunities on offer. Thus, the commodification of the day both secured its endurance and altered its significance in the minds of the population.

In modern times, there has been increased commercialisation and secular uptake. Mothering Sunday has become very much a recognition of the role of a mother in contemporary society. Gifts are sold, flowers are bought and cards are sent.

Mothers of all kinds wake up across the country knowing that this is their day. A day to be treated to lavish days out and receive gifts from loved ones. Despite the commercial forces driving the recognition, it is an important day for families coming together.






