Change and decay?

The line from the hymn "Abide with me" has made its way into the English language. Originally written by the Vicar of Brixham, Devon, Henry Francis Lyte after he had preached his final sermon to his congregation. He was dying from tuberculosis and was leaving England for a warmer climate to try to prolong his life. He had been a hardworking Minister and when friends told him he worked too hard was fond of replying "It is better to wear out than rust out."



Sadly the trip to Europe didn't extend his life for long and the hymn was first sung at his memorial service. It is a hymn of Christian triumph, starting with the quote from Luke's Gospel and the story of the Easter Sunday walk to Emmaus when Jesus draws near to two sad disciples and when they reach home they invite him to "Abide with us" so the hymn "Abide with me" found its beginning in the story of the Resurrection of Jesus. It ends with the wonderful words "Heaven's morning breaks and earth's vain shadows flee. In life, in death O Lord, abide with me." Lyte's final words as he pointed upwards were "Peace, joy!" So how can a wonderful hymn, full of hope and life have a line in it which has often been used in a way that seems to be afraid of change? Lyte wrote the line about his changing body as it got frailer with age.....perhaps some of us can relate to that. There are changes we don't like, both in ourselves and, greatest sadness of all, in the loss of friends or loved ones. Those changes are "Change and decay." Other changes however are positive and life-enhancing: the new glasses that enable us to see better, the new neighbour who is becoming a new friend, the new hip which means pain-free walking is possible.

Constant change is here to stay

Every morning I go into the study and change the desk calendar to the new day's date. I notice that I'm a day older, thank God for the new day, and remember His word "I am the Lord and I do not change." It's from Malachi, the last book in the Old Testament and it is a great promise of God's certainty and stability.

When we are anchored in Him then we can face the trials, conquer the challenges and embrace the changes that come to us. The God who says He doesn't change also promises "I am making everything new", that's from Revelation, the last book in the New Testament. I hope that will be our confident expectation as we wait to welcome the Revd Christopher Davis and his wife Mary as they move from Tooting, South London, to join and lead us here in Crewkerne.

Will they bring changes? I do hope so! As I write this the smell of fresh paint is drifting into the house because the painter has been here all day doing the exterior woodwork. It looks great. How crazy we would have been to have thought "But I like the old paint, it might have been peeling and there might have been patches of bare wood but I had got used to it, felt comfortable with it." It is just the same in the Church. I don't exactly know what Christopher Davis will do but I know he will love us in God's name, minister to us with God's Word and lead us in God's mission.

The greatest change Making us more like Christ is the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of every Christian. That's the greatest change and that changes everything else.



THE BISHOP'S LETTER



Made for a purpose

Whenever I listen to one of Jesus' searching questions to his listeners I find myself thinking "What would I do in these circumstances?"

If I were casting my nets, and Jesus said "follow me", would I do it? I imagine many of us would be hoping that we never have to find out.

All too often it's assumed that being called is just about the religious life to a particular ministry, lay or ordained in the life of the Church. Of course, it is about that for some of us, and thank God for that, but in the New Testament, vocation or calling has a much wider understanding.

St Paul talks to the Corinthians about this more general call when he writes "Now there are varieties of gifts but the same spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

Every one of us is called to use the gift or gifts we've been given to help build up the body of Christ. That "building up" can never be confined to what we do on Sunday. Building up is about using the whole of life, including Monday to Saturday. The very act of working or being at home, school, work, leisure is vocational. Our daily behaviour becomes a sacrament and an offering.

The realisation that we are being called comes in many different ways. For some, it's like a sudden flash of light as came to St. Paul on the Damascus road. But for others, it's just not that clear. In my earlier work as a Director of Ordinands and Vocation, I listened to many people who described their sense of calling as a feeling of discomfort. "Like having a toothache" someone said -their "yes" a moving towards a sense of peace and clarity.

Perhaps, as you read this, you know what God is calling you to do. Perhaps you're still searching. But remember, God has made you for a purpose. And God will work that out, but in his own time, not yours. This month's Manna is focused on our forthcoming Archdeaconry Days which will take place early next year, February 6 to 12, with the theme of "God calls... everyone, everywhere". One thing I can guarantee: if you book in, you won't be alone and you'll have a great day.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

'Strengthen me with raisins, refresh me with apples, for I am faint with love'. Song of Songs 2:5



APPLE PUDDING CAKE WITH CIDER CRUNCH TOPPING For the cake

175g mixed dried fruit

75g sultanas

225g plain flour

1 tbls baking powder

3 medium eggs, beaten, at room temperature

3 crisp eating apples (e.g. English Cox's or Braeburn)

100ml dry cider
Vegetable oil for oiling

2 teaspoons mixed spice 175g soft light brown sugar

175g cooking margarine

For the crunch topping

25g demerara sugar and 2 teaspoons dry cider

Place the dried fruit in a bowl and pour the cider over. Set aside for 2 hours to macerate.

Preheat oven to 180C/gas mark 4. Oil a 20cm round loose-based cake tin and line the base with baking parchment. Sift the flour, baking powder and spice. Using a hand-held electric mixer, cream the margarine and sugar together until light and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs along with 2 tablespoons of the flour mixture.

Grate one of the apples, including the skin ,into the mixture. Chop the second apple into small chunks and fold into the cake batter along with the rest of the flour mixture. Add the soaked dried fruit and its liquid and combine the mixture evenly. Slice the remaining apple and reserve the slices to put on top. Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin and press the apple slices on the top of the cake. Sprinkle with 2 teaspoons of the demerara sugar and bake for approx. 1 hour or until well risen and a skewer comes out clean

Cool in the tin for 30 minutes then turn out on to a wire rack to cool completely. Make the cider crunch just before serving: Mix the cider and demerara sugar to make a wet paste. Dot the crunchy paste over the cake.

A West Country recipe, a bit like old fashioned bread pudding, delicious served with clotted cream.


House Group



It has also been super to welcome back our volunteers to support reading across the school. We are so grateful for their support and generosity with their time to share their passion for reading and nurture it in our children too.












Every beast, all the cattle, every creeping thing, every fowl, every bird went to Noah and into the ark, two by two, as God had commanded him; and the Lord shut them in.






