FROM THE RECTOR

Have you ever dived down into deep water?

"Down ... into the pitch black, cold, freezing water, down into the mud and slime, then up again, [the diver's] lungs almost bursting, back again to the green and warm and sunlit water, and then at last out into the sunshine, holding in his hand the dripping thing he went down to get".



In his essay, "The Grand Miracle", CS Lewis pictures Christ as the great Diver who has come down to rescue us. It is a apt image as Christmas approaches, since it was at first Christmas that Jesus began to brave our muddy, slimy and freezing world.

That seems a particularly good description of the world this year — with ongoing post-Covid uncertainty, economic and energy crises, and war and its real risk of spreading (missiles landing in Poland and G20 world leaders being called from their beds to take counsel). The UK seems particularly hard hit.

Some of us, of course, may say, "Don't be so serious at Christmas time – we need to forget and escape!" And I certainly intend to enjoy Christmas...

But the Christian faith urges us to go much further. It tells us that we do ourselves great harm if we make "Christmas" into a tiny, transient man-made haven in the freezing mud — rather than facing the mess that we are in and taking the hand of the Diver.

The fact is that our new and grimmer experience of the world is nothing like as bad as it is for many others, and overall our story makes grim reading. The human race, for all its technology, creativity and philanthropy has never found a way out of the mess of human life. We seem ever to be the problem more than we are the solution.

Again, the Christian faith reminds us that we are stuck in the dark and cold that we create – but that there is a Diver who still holds out his hand to take us up and out. John's Gospel puts it like this: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life"

So, Happy Christmas 2022! May it be a great time of rest and good cheer – but, even more, a time to find, and re-find, the rescue and the goodness of Christ.

His light is never extinguished As 2022 comes to a close, our hearts go out to the people of Ukraine whose country was invaded by Russia on the 24 February this year. In the months since, we have watched in horror as civilians, cities and infrastructure have been attacked, land occupied and atrocities committed.

The UK has received more than 100,000 people fleeing from the conflict. The gift of their presence among us reminds us that this is no "quarrel in a far away country, between people of whom we know nothing".

As we recall once again the coming into the world of Jesus at Christmas, our challenge is to connect our celebration of his birth with the realities and consequences of the conflict that is happening. Sadly, it's not hard to see the links. Jesus was born in a land (Palestine) that had been annexed by an expansionist foreign power (Rome) in pursuit of its territorial ambitions. The demands of the Roman occupiers meant that Jesus' birth happened not at home in Nazareth, but at a counting centre - Bethlehem. He was born in a stable because 'there was no room at the inn'. While still a baby, Jesus became a refugee when taken to Egypt due to warnings of atrocities to come.

Viewed this way, the Christmas story is no sentimental fable. It is a brutal foreshadowing of the events that Ukraine and our whole world have encountered this year. At the same time, it is also a story of hope. For it tells us that even in the very worst that can happen the Christ child whose birth we celebrate knows all too well the realities of the human condition. As a result, in any darkness his light is never extinguished. For he is Emmanuel – God with us.

So as we come to the end of 2022 we give thanks that God is always with us in whatever we face. May he be with Ukraine. May he be with Russia. And may he be welcomed by us all.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Nehemiah said "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is holy to our Lord"



Nehemiah 8:10

AMERICAN CHRISTMAS FRUIT CAKE

250g Dates , pitted
250g glace pineapple
125g glace apricots

125g each of red and green glace cherries

250g Brazil nuts
2 eggs
100g brown sugar
1 tablespoon rum
1 teaspoon vanilla essence
90g butter softened
75g plain flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder

pinch of salt 12 tablespoons rum or brandy, extra

Preheat the oven to 150 degrees C. Grease and line a 23 x 12 cm loaf tin.

Chop the dates, pineapple and apricots into fairly large pieces, but leave the cherries and nuts whole. Mix well.

Beat the eggs until light and fluffy, add the sugar, rum, vanilla and soft butter. Continue beating until well blended.

Sift the flour with the baking powder and salt, add to the creamed mixture with the fruit and nuts, and mix well. Spoon into the prepared tin.

Bake for approximately 90 minutes, or until the cake is firm to touch and a skewer comes out clean.

The cake may have a surface layer of melted butter - on cooling this will settle and moisten the cake.

Remove from the oven, and while still hot, pour extra rum or brandy over. Cool in the tin standing on a wire rack.

A GLIMPSE AT THE MOTHERS' UNION AROUND THE WORLD

Mothers' Union is an international Christian membership movement supporting families and communities in need of support in the UK and worldwide since 1876, and is active in 84 countries and works tirelessly to serve their communities whilst offering Christian care for families, regardless of faith or background.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA

Most MU members in the Diocese of **Aipo Rongo** are rural village women, who have very little or no education. They live in the toughest terrain; high mountains, deep gorges and valleys prevent them from accessing essential basic services, such as roads and communication systems. However, this does not prevent them from their weekly prayer meetings and being part of Mothers' Union.

In the Diocese of **Dogura**, women engaged in art and craft are finding markets overseas to sell their products, empowered to become self sustaining to alleviate poverty and improve their livelihoods. They develop values, self worth and self-confidence, finding their rightful place in their society so that men may not continue to suppress them.

SOUTH SUDAN

The country is caught up in political and tribal conflict; the male population are sadly killed or are made jobless due to displacement. This means many of the households in South Sudan are now female led. Mothers' Union members have been in the heart of the communities holding life changing workshops. With the confidence of their new found literacy brings, women are able to tackle their new responsibilities, both in their personal lives and to benefit the wider community.

Bringing the various tribes together across South Sudan to take part in the workshops not only teaches them valuable life skills, but unites conflicting tribes together, promoting peace between them.

So, here in Crewkerne we try to help with prayer and donations when we can. We meet on the third Tuesday of the month at 2.30pm in the church hall. Join us for our Christmas Tea on December 6th at3pm.
